The Story

A mysterious guest arrives who shocks Fritz, but Clara knows him to be their uncle Herr Drosselmeyer the toy maker who presents Clara with the best gift of all, the Nutcracker. Fritz grows jealous, snatches the Nutcracker from Clara, and breaks it. Clara is upset, but Herr Drosselmeyer magically repairs her treasured gift. The party picks up with dancing and celebration. As the evening grows late and the children get sleepy, the guests thank the Stahlbaums and bid farewell. Once the family is in bed, Clara sneaks downstairs to check on her Nutcracker and ends up falling asleep under the Christmas tree.

At the stroke of midnight Clara wakes up to find the Christmas tree and toys growing larger as she seems to be shrinking! Suddenly she is surrounded by an army of mice led by the Mouse King. The Nutcracker commands a group of toy soldiers into battle with the mice. The Mouse King traps the Nutcracker, but Clara comes to his rescue. She throws her slipper and hits the Mouse King in the head, allowing the Nutcracker to defeat the Mouse King. The victorious Nutcracker becomes a prince who takes Clara on a magical journey to the Land of Snow. They are welcomed by the Snow Queen, and as the snow continues to fall, snowflakes begin to dance.

Clara continues on her journey and is met by angels who escort her to the Kingdom of the Sweets. There she is greeted by the Sugar Plum Fairy, who hears Clara's story of the Prince's battle with the Mouse King and of her own bravery. The Sugar Plum Fairy rewards her with a celebration of dances of beautiful flowers and every imaginable treat. The festival concludes when everyone comes together to bid Clara farewell.

Betsy Hausburg—Director

Upon graduating cum laude with a BA in Dance from Butler University, Betsy Hausburg got her first professional job as soloist with the Syracuse Ballet Theatre. A year later, she took a job as costumer for the Hartford Ballet Company. When directorship of the company changed, she was rehired as company member and dean of students in charge of the two-year teacher training program. Betsy married and moved to California several years later. She founded the East Bay Ballet Theatre in Albany, California, and then went on to teach for Miss Penny's in Castro Valley. There she and Penny Tomasello founded the Valley Dance Theatre in 1980. Along with directing and teaching for the Valley Dance Theatre, Betsy is the choreographer for all Livermore High School musicals and the tuba player for the Livermore-Amador Symphony.

Don Adkins—Conductor

Dr. Don Adkins has taught music in the Santa Cruz area, primarily at Cabrillo College, for more than 35 years. He has music degrees from Western Oregon State College in music education, the University of Idaho in composition, and the University of Missouri at Kansas City in orchestral conducting. Don has taught for both public schools and organizations such as the Cabrillo Youth Strings. He conducts the Cabrillo College Community Orchestra and Livermore-Amador Symphony's summer youth orchestra, performs as a piano accompanist, music directs for musical theater, and is the music director at his church.

Vintage Brass Quintet—Carols

The Vintage Brass Quintet includes Rick Flee and Bob Bryant, trumpets; Jeremy Lawton, horn; Chris Lawson, trombone; and Marcus Schildbach, tuba. The quintet is a group of local musicians who have enjoyed playing together for more than 25 years. Their repertoire covers a wide range of styles. Although heavily influenced by the Canadian Brass, the Vintage Brass Quintet enjoys the challenges offered by the enormous variety of musical styles available for the brass quintet ensemble, from jazz to classical to show tunes. The group rehearses regularly throughout the year, while performing both publicly and privately. As hobbyist musicians, all members contribute to the group in some way, be it through helping book performances for the group or helping during rehearsals.

Maxwell Simoes—Guest Artist

Maxwell Simoes grew up in Philadelphia, PA, where he attended the Creative and Performing Arts High School and trained with Olga Kresin and Lev Assulyak. He was awarded gold at the Tanzolymp international dance festival in Berlin and was a finalist in the New York City competition for Youth America Grand Prix. Following this success, he studied at the Rudra Béjart École in Switzerland as a student of Azari Plissetski. This in turn led to performing with the Béjart Ballet in pieces choreographed by Maurice Béjart, including *Bolero*, *Le Sacre du Printemps*, and *Petruschka*. Maxwell has also performed with the Metropolitan Opera, The San Francisco Opera, Smuin Ballet, Les Grands Ballets Canadiens, and Sadler's Wells in London. Now Maxwell dances with Jacob Jonas The Company in Santa Monica, where he performed in a recent Sia music video. Along with freelance projects and teaching, he has performed for fashion brands such as Hermès, Prada, and Greg Lauren.

Roberto Vega Ortiz—Guest Artist

Roberto Vega Ortiz began his dance training at Taller de Bailes LeDaph at age 14. He also studied at Escuela de Ballets de San Juan, Conservatorio de Ballet Concierto de Puerto Rico, and Escuela Especializada en Ballet Julián E. Blanco, all in his native Puerto Rico. He took summer courses at, for example, the Joffrey Ballet School and San Francisco Ballet School. In 2015, he studied at the Miami City Ballet School, and in 2016 he joined the Nashville Ballet. In 2017, he joined Les Ballets Trockadero de Monte Carlo and toured internationally, performing female soloist and principal roles on pointe. A guest dancer with various companies, Roberto was also a cast member of *The Phantom of the Opera* in San Juan, Puerto Rico. He joined Diablo Ballet in 2019 and is the co-founder, artistic director, and artist of Ballet22.
